National Numeracy Day

Number 7 Go for the one 7 tip

1. BREAK IT DOWN
If you have a maths question that feels scary, break it down into smaller chunks and do one bit at a time.

2. TAKE YOUR TIME
You don't have to work out the answer quickly when you're doing maths and it's okay if it takes you longer than someone else to get the answer.

3. DON'T GIVE UP
It's easy to make mistakes – it's part of learning. If you get things wrong, don't give up. It might be hard but if you keep trying – and ask for help if you need it – you will get the hang of it.

4. BELIEVE IN YOURSELF
Maths isn't one of the best bits of maths with a bit of practice. So, don't say "I can't do maths". Start learning together with us!



MATHS CIRCLE ACTIVITIES



Times Tables Rock Stars

Try NumBots' Bot Bingo this National Numeracy Day – a downloadable, interactive number game for use in the classroom. (5+)




Models and representations to support the teaching of number bonds


Ten Frames
Makes counting values simpler. We can use them to make and split numbers in relation to 5 and 10. They help form the basis for understanding place value in the future.




Part Part Whole Model
Within the part whole model, you can use real objects, concrete objects, pictures or numbers. The two parts combine to make the whole and can support with addition and subtraction.




Dienes/Basis 10
Can be used practically or drawn to support addition and subtraction.




Bar Model
Remove a number for problem solving opportunities across all operations (+, -, x, ÷)



Number Line
Can be used to count forwards and backwards or to identify number bonds and patterns.



Bead Strings
Usually consists of 10, 20 or 100 beads on a string, grouped by colour. They allow children to move the beads while counting and recording groups of ten.

Quick Number Natter Talking Points

Use the Quick Number Natter talking points below to spark short, informal conversations in your organisation. Add the Big Number Natter as an agenda item to your meetings and spend a few minutes on the talking points. Or ask everyone to start a quick number natter using these talking points during a coffee break, at the water cooler...any time!

Talking Point 1: Give me one word.
What is one word that describes how you feel about maths, positive or negative? Why?

Talking Point 2: Love it? Loathe it?
Love it or loathe it, everyone has something to say about maths. What's your number story?

Talking Point 3: How many of us?
Around half of UK adults have the numeracy levels expected of a primary school child. Does this surprise you?


Talking Point 4: Everyday maths

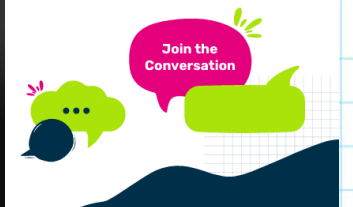
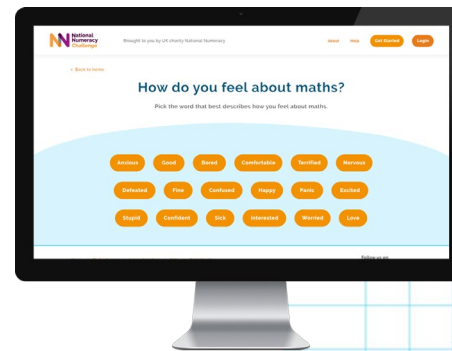

A step-by-step guide

1. Share your Big Number Natter stories, video clips or images

THE BIG NUMBER NATTER FOR STAFF, PARENTS AND CARERS

Support your own staff and other adults in your community:

-  1. **Hold a Big Number Natter session with groups of colleagues or parents/carers:** Your toolkit includes resources to make this easy and straightforward for you, including guidance on how to plan a session, a poster to promote your session, conversation-starter suggestions for small informal sessions, and a slide deck for longer, more formal sessions.
-  2. **Encourage staff to join in:** Ask colleagues and leaders to share their own Big Number Natter videos, images and stories about their personal experience of numbers, good or bad. Share these with your school community and on social media using #BigNumberNatter. They can tag your organisation using your social media handles so it can be reshared on your official channels.
-  3. **Encourage parents to join in:** Ask parents/carers to share their Big Number Natter videos, stories and images with you using #BigNumberNatter. They can tag your organisation using your social media handles so it can be reshared on your official channels.

WHAT IS NATIONAL NUMERACY DAY?

National Numeracy Day builds brighter futures through confidence with numbers.

- It is run by independent charity National Numeracy and the campaign's Founding Supporter, KPMG.
- It is the UK's only day dedicated to everyday maths.
- It celebrates the importance of numbers in everyday life and inspires children and adults to improve their numeracy, because improving numeracy changes lives at home, work and school.
- National Numeracy Day has inspired people to take 1.5 million to improve their numeracy since 2018.
- Everything is free! The campaign's generous supporters ensure all our resources are free for everyone to use.

WHY IS NATIONAL NUMERACY DAY IMPORTANT?

- The UK's numeracy levels are significantly below the average for developed countries.
- **49% of the UK's working-age population have the expected numeracy levels of a primary school child.**
- **Millions of children leave school lacking number confidence.** 30% of school-leavers (18-24s) feel anxious about using maths and numbers. They are the most maths-anxious adult group in the UK.
- Poor numeracy costs the UK economy £25 billion a year.
- Struggling with numbers can make people more vulnerable to debt, unemployment, poor health and fraud – all of which have been exacerbated by the cost-of-living crisis.

CAMPAIGN AIMS

The campaign drives:

Awareness

The campaign will raise awareness of the numeracy issue and will support people across the UK to see why understanding and working with numbers in real life – at work and at home – is so important.

The campaign will promote the wider benefits of good numeracy for communities, society and the UK economy.

Engagement

The campaign will encourage meaningful engagement through event attendance and use of our practical resources and activities which focus on our three main themes: managing money, getting on at work, and supporting children.

Action

The campaign will empower adults to improve their number confidence and skills by using the National Numeracy Challenge.

The campaign will inspire children to consider the ways they'll need to use numbers and maths outside of the classroom, from their hobbies and interests to their future careers.
