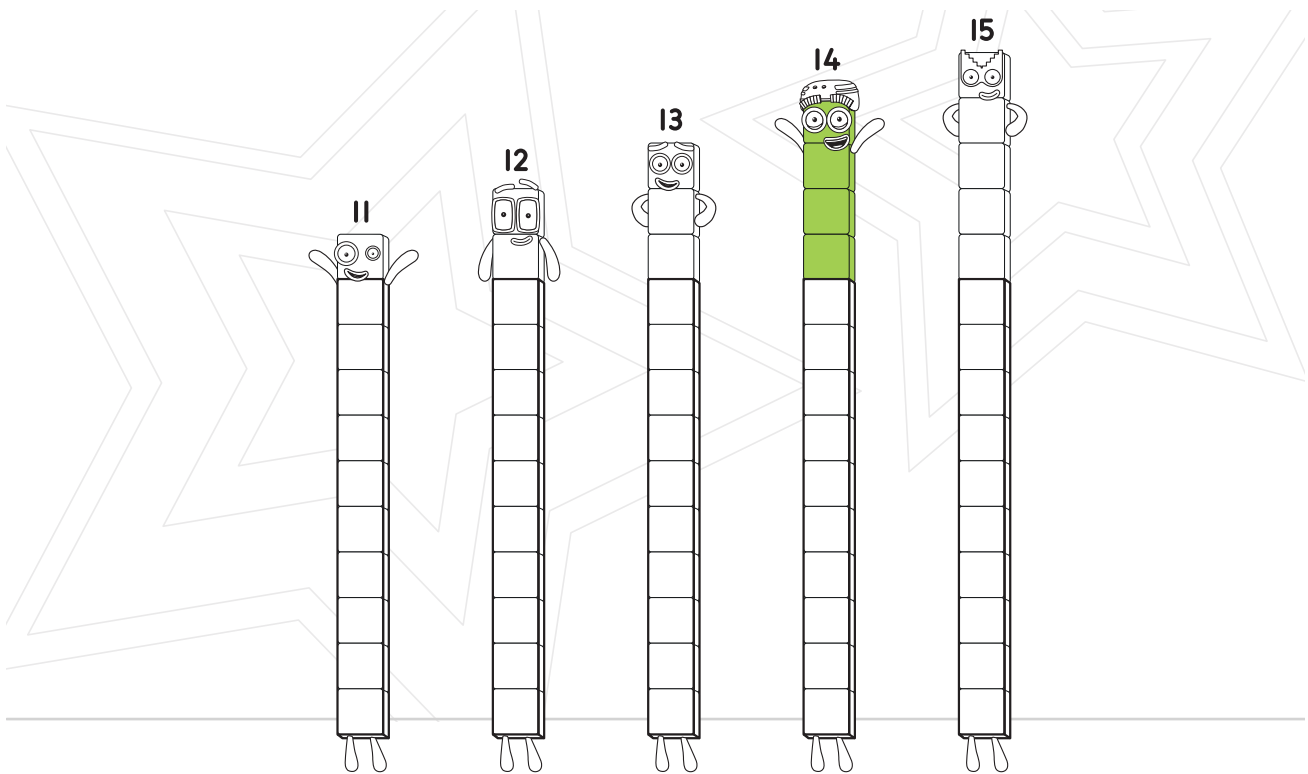


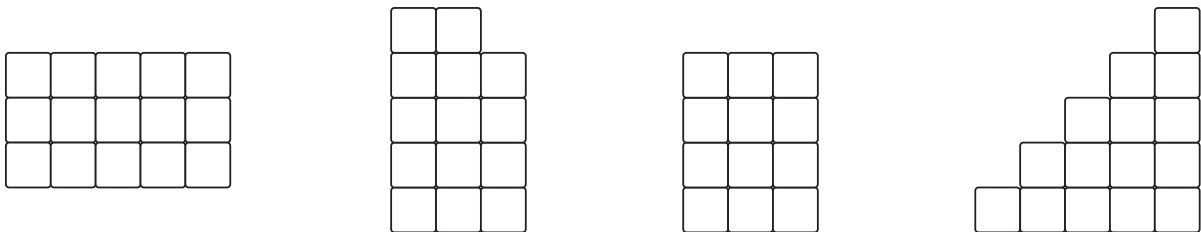
# Fifteen's Minute of Fame

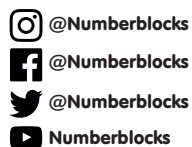


Which shapes below have 15 blocks? Can you circle them?

## Notes for grown-ups

### MATHEMATICS

This activity encourages children to recognise the 'ten and a bit' structure of numbers 11 to 15. Our number system is built around tens and being able to split numbers into smaller numbers will support children to calculate more efficiently when they are older.

### ACTIVITIES

- Colour 'ten and a friend' hiding inside the numbers 11 – 15.
- Match the picture to the number

### ACTIVITY SOLUTIONS AND EXPECTATIONS

As you colour the Numberblocks, encourage children to talk about what they notice, e.g. 14 is made of 10 and 4, 10 and 4 make 14.

You could use pasta shapes, buttons, blocks or similar to make your own Step Squad patterns.



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
