Round One: Wild About Numbers

Q1. Some animals live for a very long time. Which of these is the world's oldest known animal?

Answer: C - Jonathan the 190 year old tortoise.

Fun fact: Jonathan lives on the Island of Saint Helena in the Pacific Ocean. Jonathan has lived 69 years longer than the oldest ever human being. He features on the island's 5p coin.

Q2. Four little pigs bought a pizza for a picnic. What should they cut the pizza into so that each of them gets a fair share?

Answer: C - Quarters.

Q3. Baby Bear eats seven boxes of porridge a week. Daddy Bear eats double that amount. How many boxes of porridge does Daddy Bear eat?

Answer: C - 14.

Q4. The world's shortest adult dog is a Chihuahua called Pearl. How short do you think she is?

Answer: B - 9.1cm.

Fun fact: Pearl the Chihuahua is shorter than a tin of baked beans!



Answer: A - zero.

Fun fact: Sharks don't have bones like we do. Instead, they have cartilage - a kind of flexible tissue that helps them to float.

Round two: Maths Mysteries

Q1. Mathematicians are all born good at maths - true or false?

Answer: D - 1,279.

Q2. A football match is 90 minutes long but sometimes, games have to go into extra time. How long did the longest ever football match last?

Answer: C - 203 minutes.

Q3. The longest cake ever made measured 5,300 meters long. That's as long as approximately how many football pitches?

Answer: D - 50 football pitches.

Q4. Kristine Lilly holds the record for most international caps earned by a female football player - true or false?

Answer: True - during her career, Kristine Lilly won 354 caps for the US women's national team between 1987 and 2010.

Q5. Everyone can get better at football with practice - true or false?
